

Report on inauguration of KL-ACE

KLU is well known for 100% placement for the last 10 years. Now, we are moving one step forward to give coaching for major competitive exams so that the students can go for higher education in India and abroad and can settle in government jobs. Being amidst the present condition of competitive world, each student is facing a lot of competition for all major jobs or higher studies. Unless students plan properly and systematically while pursuing under graduation itself, it is very difficult for them to fulfil their dream. To overcome all these issues and facilitate the students and bring into one platform, KLU established the ACE. In this connection KLU launched all major competitive exams training for existing students.
